

# Brighton film locations



- 1 **The West Pier** formed the backdrop for Sir Richard Attenborough's: "Oh! What a lovely war" as well as featuring in "Carry On at your Convenience". Opposite the pier is the Regency restaurant which is where Brighton residents got to see moving pictures for the first time.
- 2 **The Grand** hotel has featured in a number of films including "Brighton Rock", "Mona Lisa" and "Quadrophenia" as Sting's Ace worked here as a concierge.
- 3 **Brighton Pier and the Beachfront** have also appeared in a lot of films including "The End of the Affair", "Brighton Rock" and Woody Allen's "Cassandra's Dream".
- 4 **Madeira Drive** is where the London to Brighton Veteran Car Run ends and was therefore featured in the classic comedy "Genevieve" as well as appearing in "Wimbledon" and the "End of the Affair".
- 5 **East Street Alley** has now become a mecca for "Quadrophenia" fans as when the riots spilled over from the beachfront into the Lanes, Phil Daniels and Leslie Ash escaped into this alley which today is covered in messages from fans.
- 6 **Duke of York's cinema** is the oldest cinema in the country and will be celebrating its centenary in 2010. This art house cinema has comfy armchairs and sofas as well as homemade cakes.
