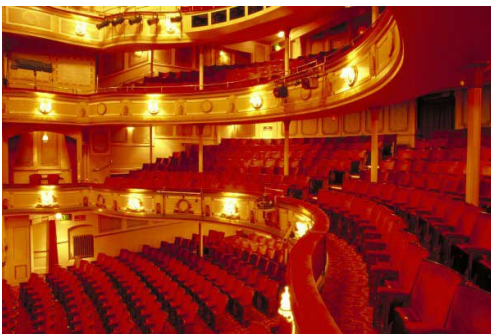


Culture
