

Shopping



- **The Lanes** are Brighton's historic quarter consisting of an intricate maze of twisting alleyways with an extraordinary mix of antiques, jewellery, interior design and famous labels as well as tempting chocolate delights.
Main Streets: East Street, Dukes Lanes, Duke Street, Meeting House Lane



- **North Laine** is a bohemian bustle of criss-cross streets; the cultural quarter of the city is home to over 300 individual shops where you can buy anything including retro candy, vegetarian shoes, and bespoke tailoring.

- **Kemp Town** is a flamboyant mix of grand seafront crescents, elegant squares, and a bustling shopping area with a lively village feel.
Main Streets: St James's Street, Upper St James's Street, St George's Road



- **Brighton Marina** is only a mile from central Brighton, and has the city's only outlet shopping centre plus a range of other ladies, mens, childrenswear, sports goods and homeware www.brightonmarina.co.uk
- **The Artists' Quarter** houses 30 local artists who work and sell from their studios, which are converted fisherman's huts. Continue walking west towards Hove and you will find a further sprinkling of interiors shops along the beach.
