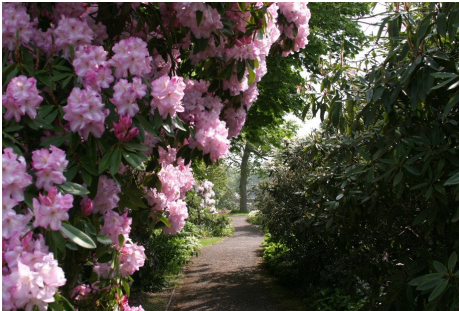


Gardens
