- **All Saints Parish Church**

Victorian architecture based on 13th century French Gothic style. Designed by JL Pearson, architect of Truro Cathedral.

- **St Bartholomew's Church**

Based on the supposed dimensions of Noah's ark, this Grade I listed building was built by architect Edmund Scott and opened in 1874.



- **St Peter's, Preston Old Church**

In a small wooded churchyard adjoining the 18th century Preston Manor, this simple 13th century flint church makes a pleasing mediaeval contrast with its suburban surroundings

- **St Margaret's Church**
